125 Years of Remembering, Celebrating, Looking Forward

On April 21 and 22, the members (both current and former) of Eastport United Methodist Church enjoyed celebrating the church's 125th anniversary. And, boy, did we celebrate! Gathering on Saturday night at Calvary United Methodist Church, which graciously hosted the ever-changing number of participants, we ate and talked and laughed and danced our way through the evening.

The night started with hors d'oeuvres (We're United Methodists – we gotta' eat, right?). But the real start to the evening was simply walking in the door and hugging your way to the food table. There were friends you hadn't seen in years – people who set aside the time and made it a priority to be here, despite the distance. They came from South Carolina, Tennessee, New Jersey, Delaware, and who knows where else.

There were also your friends who you see every Sunday, but extra hugs just seemed called for. After all, this was a special event!

Eventually everyone wandered down the steps to the Fellowship Hall, which was completely filled with table after table, waiting for guests to settle down.

But before finding a place to sit, one wall beckoned to guests – featuring picture after picture highlighting the proud history of Eastport UMC. And what a history!

How many other churches can claim to be the “Church on Wheels” as the Eastport church came to be known in 1913, when it moved from Third Street (now Fourth) to the corner of First and Chesapeake. Though the move took two weeks, the congregation didn't let a little thing like a church in transition stop them from holding services in their somewhat mobile church.

There were also moments of déjà vu, moments of coming full circle – as when the church sold its old building to the Seventh Day Adventists.

And look at all those faces! Over the years, pictures of Sunday School classes and Christmas pageants, mission trips and Ghosts of Peach Festivals Past. Soul Searchers, then and now – it was all there.

But finally it was time to eat and fill those tummies with chicken, roast beef, mac and cheese, green beans – the true staples of any Methodist covered dish supper. Comfort food, hallelujah, Amen!

After dinner, the program began, which offered recognition of older members (in the 85+ club) and even younger members (the church's current confirmation class).

Along the way we got to hear and sing favorite songs. Awards were presented to the movers and shakers in the congregation. And pastors from several eras of Eastport's history shared their memories.

As a finale, “Celebrate Good Times” rang out in the Fellowship Hall, while several dance-challenged ladies nonetheless strutted their stuff, and then proceeded to get others off their feet and dancing down the aisles.

But it wasn't really a finale because there was the special anniversary service the next day. The church was packed, and what a beautiful sight to see full pews. The opening processional was as triumphant as any Easter Sunday.

During the service, music rang out – literally, in the case of the Heavenly Bells – joyously celebrating 125 years of service and blessings. One of the more poignant moments was to watch and listen to 40 years of Soul Searchers singing together.

Rev. Chris Holmes, district superintendent, delivered a stirring message, “Still Faithful,” which told of God's grace through the years – in good times and in bad.

Later as communion was served by Rev. Holmes and former and current Eastport ministers (Revs. Ankeny, Moreland and Barcelo) and lay speakers, the congregation moved forward to accept their Lord, knowing how truly blessed our church has been.

Each person who attended the celebration will have his or her special memories of this momentous occasion. Briefly, I will share mine – I hope others will come forward and share theirs.

As a relative short-timer (only 12 years of membership) and not being a native Annapolitan, I enjoyed learning more about my church's history. But that history truly came alive for me in two small moments over the weekend. First, at the dinner, Mitch and I were seated across from Mike and Lisa Stevens, and their young daughter, Taylor. When the Stevens family was recognized as descendants of the founders of Eastport, they stood, with the other members of their family.

Once seated, we asked how many generations were represented. Indicating Taylor, they responded that she was a sixth-generation member of the church. The second moment came when I was blessed to be helping with communion. As members of the church came forward, one elderly gentleman stood out. He whispered to me, "My uncle started this church, and this is so wonderful." I learned later I had served communion to Bobby Stevens, the nephew of our founder, Philip Stevens. So there it was for me – the entire history of Eastport laid out.

Our history, full circle, from an elderly gentleman who connected to Eastport's start to a little girl who will play a part in its future.

Indeed, a full-circle celebration, connecting past and present in an unbroken line of service to our Lord. Happy anniversary, Eastport!
