Christ was born into a weary world. King Herod ruled the land with a legacy of ruthlessness. The Romans treated the people of Israel with

contempt, imposing harsh taxes and land seizures that forced many into subsistence farming. Poverty and destitution were pervasive. And yet, Christ was born, bringing good news of great joy for all people.

As Advent comes again to a weary world, we ask, "How does a weary world rejoice?" From the opening chapters of Luke's Gospel, we have found a few answers: we acknowledge our weariness, we find joy in connection, we allow ourselves to be amazed, we sing stories of hope, we make room, we root ourselves in ritual, and most importantly, we trust our belovedness. In the parallel birth stories of Jesus and John, joy arrives—despite trepidation, fear, or grief. In these stories, we find rhythms for rejoicing. As we move through our series, we hope to create space for acknowledging the weariness of our world while celebrating God's closeness with great joy.

And so, this Advent, we will hold space for our weariness and our joy. We will seek a "thrill of hope" in our hurting world. We will welcome joy—even if, like the prophet Isaiah, we cry out for comfort (Isaiah 40:1). In this weary world, may we find many ways to rejoice. Please join us during this season!

Garden & Maintenance News

Many thanks to Molly Estabrook, Mike Keller, Jill Peddicord, Barbara Krebs, and Theresa Sise who helped clean the picnic tables and signs, pull weeds, and bag a lot of leaves during our fall clean-up days.



We continue to mulch and bag leaves as they keep falling. Outside doors and window frames were also cleaned. Jerry edged all the sidewalks. Jerry also repaired the mower belt that came off its pulley. It is a little chewed up so we ordered a new belt for it. The leaf blower stopped working and we can't figure it out or find a shop that will repair it. New batteries were installed in the thermostat in fellowship hall and clocks were changed an hour forward. The church bottom row of 32 shutters were washed, sanded, primed and painted. We need help taking down some of the shutters in the top row to repair.

Happily we have started receiving checks (\$549) for the electricity used by the cell phone tower this month. Because of that, our previous projects, and using the shutters and new blinds, our electric bill is way down. We are working on T Mobile cleaning the outside of the white steeple which has been getting dirty over the last 15 years.

From the Finance Committee

Often, people have charitable intentions, and truly want to support their church, but they may be on a fixed or limited



income. There are various ways to consider to incorporate charitable giving into your budget.

ACH giving, with recurring monthly or semimonthly deductions, allows predictability, and the ability to choose the best timing around your income and other recurring obligations. It can also avoid processing fees for the church.

The end of the year provides other planning opportunities. For those who itemize income tax dedications, you may support the missions of the church and receive the tax benefit of a charitable deduction.

If you are a senior who is required to withdraw minimum (RMD) annual distributions from your IRA, 401K, or other qualified plan (or anyone else with an inherited IRA account with RMDs), the amount you are required to withdraw is added to your taxable income. This additional required distribution of income can even boost you up into a higher tax bracket, which is undesirable.

Did you know that you can direct the RMD distribution (if you don't need some or all of those funds for your own support) to a church or charity?

In this way, the funds are not included in your income for tax purposes. This is even more beneficial to you than a charitable deduction. This is called a QCD (qualified charitable distribution) and the entire amount is excluded from your income for tax purposes.

Contact your account advisor or investment representative to request the QCD form. The income tax is avoided by using this specific mechanism when the funds go directly from the IRA to the charity.

Baltimore/Washington Conference Re-Structuring

Bishop LaTrelle Easterling and a task force of Conference leaders initiated this fall a possible re-structuring of the Baltimore/Washington Conference of the United Methodist Church. Its purpose is to examine how to equip districts, local churches, and other partners for fruitful missions and ministries. The goals:

- A structure that makes the main thing *The Main Thing*--making disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world.
- Every church should be the body of Christ in motion.

The task force will be seeking the voice of laity and clergy in the Conference through surveys, listening sessions, and small group conversations. The restructuring proposal is expected to be brought to the Annual Meeting of the Baltimore/Washington Conference next May.
