#### From the Pastor

You remember that passage from 1 Corinthians 13, right? The love chapter. You've heard it so many times before.

This is a letter to a community of believers that has amazing ministry happening. Within the Corinthian community spiritual gifts abound and they are "doers of the word" not just hearers. They had mountainmoving faith. They gave generously, lavishly.

Then Paul chimes in. "So what?"

Wait a minute. All of these things are bearing such fruit! How can Paul write this off? Sure, maybe there's some rough edges (that's sarcasm, if you look deeper into the life of the Corinthian church) but they had it going on!

Paul points out an underlying issue: They have not love.

Anything great they are doing? It's not worth it if they do not have love. It's a noisy cymbal, a clanging gong. Excellent works without love are worse than a cat leaping through the percussion section.

Paul takes time to remind the folks at First Church of Corinth what love truly is.

"Love is patient and kind; love does not envy or boast; it is not arrogant or rude. It does not insist on its own way; it is not irritable or resentful; it does not rejoice at wrongdoing, but rejoices with the truth. Love bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things" (1 Corinthians 13:4-7).

We can do amazing things, but if we don't do it in love with and for one another? It's a wash.

I need this reminder too often. Perhaps this is timely for you as well.

God, forgive us and fill in the broken places with your love. Amen.


#### Women in Faith
