Parade: Come watch with us (in the shade)! The parade kicks off at 10am from St. John's College and works its way up to Maryland Hall, the new festival location.

Our group of spectators will gather at 209 West St. Across the street from Lighthouse Bistro/Sailor Oyster Bar at Southgate Ave and West St. This is equidistant between the Knighton and One Park Place garages. This is also a great spot because there is space for people to be dropped off (prior to the parade start) if the walk is a bit far. Bring your own lawn chair if you wish.

We hope to arrive around 8:30am to secure the spot; the streets close up around 9:40am. The parade begins at 10am and lasts just over an hour.

Festival: Same day, at Maryland Hall. We have secured a booth at the festival following the parade. There we will provide hospitality (water, coffee, etc.) and distribute information about our church and other churches in the area. It's also a great place to come and rest if you need a break from walking around visiting other displays and vendors.


