

Garden & Maintenance News


Thanks to Donna Armstrong for pulling weeds in two of the gardens. Thanks to my husband, Jerry, who has been picking up all the trash and doing all the



mowing alone since my back injury. And thanks to Jill Peddicord for helping me fix up the new Homework and Reading group classroom downstairs. I am sure they and our Sunday school children will enjoy it.

We have been working on getting estimates for an accessibility ramp or wheelchair lift for the basement. We want all our non-profit groups, as well as ourselves, to be able to support those with mobility issues in the future. Pastor Chris, Jill, and I are working on a grant to cover the cost of these improvements.

Our exciting news is that T Mobile, who rents our steeple for their cell phone tower, has agreed to a settlement for the last 15 years of their electricity use. We will receive a check for \$58, 451. 11 in a week or two to save for future maintenance work needed on the church. Special thanks to my engineer husband for figuring out that our high electric bills were the result of T Mobile never putting their own meter in 15 years ago. They will install a new meter in October and start paying their electric bill monthly along with paying their rent.

Thanks to the Eastport Fire Department for giving us an AED unit (automated external defibrillator) for our building. They have provided training and we hope to install it in the next month in case of a medical emergency.

Please keep all our workers and volunteers in your prayers to stay safe while they do repairs on our church. If anyone has any extra time and can help with church gardens, lawns, and maintenance, we would greatly appreciate it. We can really use the help while I recuperate.
